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1911 ARKANSAS CIVIL WAR VETERAN CENSUS

STRICKLIN, WILLIAM THOMAS of DeQueen, Ark. was born Apr. 12, 1844 at Moores Bridge, Tuscaloosa Co., Ala. the son of WILLIAM THOMAS STRICKLIN of Tenn. who moved to Tuscaloosa, Ala. and died there in 1841, lived many years in Tuscaloosa. He was the son of THOMAS STRICKLIN. Maiden name of subject's mother was SALLIE ROBINSON, whose mother was POLLIE ROBINSON of Tuscaloosa, Ala. "Lem Hudgens was my first and last teacher and I only went to school 35 days in all my life." Subject was a farmer "now 71 years old and a Democrat - True Blue to the End!" and a Missionary Baptist. Entered the Service of Civil War in the spring of 1861, was a Private all thru the war in Co. A 19th Ala. Regt. Married HARRIET ANN STRICKLAND, dau. of KINGARD and RHODA STRICKLAND, in Tuscaloosa, Ala. Nov. 1867. Children:

STRICKLAND, WILLIS K. of Mist, Ark. was born Apr. 5, 1844 in Pickens Co., Ala. the son of KENNEL STRICKLAND of NC and NANCY HORTON. He was educated in the country schools of Choctaw Co, Miss., was a Democrat and a Missionary Baptist. Enlisted Jan. 1, 1862 in Co D 45th Miss. Regt. Was wounded at Battle of Perryville, Ky. and slightly wounded at Atlanta, Ga. Married SALCIA MORMON, dau. of James and Millie MORMON, Feb. 16, 1865, Choctaw Co, Miss. Children:

CHEROKEE COUNTY DEED BOOK "A"

Pages 82, 83: 30 May 1833. JOHN STRICKLAND of Bulloch County, GA. to PETER STRICKLAND of Bryan County, GA. Lot 102, District 15, Section 2 (40 acres) of Cherokee County, GA. Witnessed by: Thomas F. JONES; Nathaniel JOHNES, JP. Recorded 23 July 1833, Cherokee County.

Pages 83, 84: 5 June 1833. PETER STRICKLAND of Bryan County, GA. to James EPPINGER of Chatham County, GA. Lot 102, District 15, Section 2 (40 acres) of Cherokee County, GA. Witnessed by: James T. DAVIS; Jas CLELAND. Recorded 22 July 1833, Cherokee County.

Pages 84, 85: 20 May \_\_\_\_: Elijah MARTIN of Bulloch County, GA. to JOHN STRICKLAND of Bulloch County, GA. Lot 102 District 15, Section 2, Cherokee County, GA. Witnessed by: James NEWMAN; PETER STRICKLAND.

Bryan County, Georgia, Affidavit: PETER STRICKLAND witnessed Elijah MARTIN sign above deed on 1st day of June 1833; Recorded 22 July 1833.

(Note: The above deeds are for the same land lot in Cherokee Co. In the first deed, JOHN STRICKLAND sold the lot to PETER STRICKLAND for \$35. Peter then sold the lot to James EPPINGER for \$55, a gain of \$20 on the lot. Elijah MARTIN apparently acquired the lot from James Eppinger; then sold it to JOHN STRICKLAND for \$30. All of the transactions took place within a few months time, with JOHN and PETER both earning a profit on the same lot. It appears our Strickland ancestors were very good Real Estate Salesmen.)

Page 86: 27 June 1833. PETER STRICKLAND of Bryan County, GA, to James EPPINGER of Chatham County, GA. Lot No. 835 District 2 (40 acres) Cherokee County, GA, drawn by Elizabeth BARBER, a widow of Bryan County, GA. Witnessed by: Geo. ASH; James CLELAND, JP. Recorded 22 July 1833, Cherokee County, GA.

Page \_\_\_\_: 7 April 1833. Elizabeth BARBER of Bryan County, GA. to PETER STRICKLAND of Bryan County, GA. Lot 835, District 2 Section 2 of Cherokee County. Witnessed by: Nelly (x) CANADY; James H. McELWANE JP.

## ELISHA STRICKLAND OF WAKE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA

The following is a report on Elisha Strickland compiled from research paid for by our 'Research Fund,' and from other printed sources.

ELISHA STRICKLAND, son of Jacob STRICKLAND (who died 1790 in Nash Co, NC), was living in Johnston County, North Carolina, by July 22, 1761, when he patented 700 acres of land (Grant #19) on the south side of Magazine Creek, a Branch of Little River.

On August 9, 1779, he patented two grants in Wake County adjoining his land. One of the grants consisted of 73 acres (Grant #147) on both sides of Mocoson Swamp; the other was 638 acres on Mocoson Swamp (Grant #109). Seven months later, he received a grant (#363) of 640 acres, dated March 29, 1780, on Turkey Creek bordering the county line. On January 6, 1781, he patented 50 acres in Nash County on the County line near BRYANT's Spring Branch.

From 1785 to 1794, ELISHA sold portions of his patents. The first parcel was sold on March 5, 1785, to Jesse BUNN (from the Aug. 9, 1779 grant), 117 acres south of Rocky Mockerson. This deed (Wake County Deed Book G, p. 89) was witnessed by Abel STRICKLAND and Patty STRICKLAND.

On March 3, 1786, ELISHA sold 85 acres to Thomas GAY. The land adjoined land of ELISHA, Thomas GAY and Joseph NORRIS (from the patent of Aug. 9, 1779). This deed was witnessed by Mathew STRICKLAND, Richard UPCHURCH and Charles UPCHURCH. (Wake County Deed Book H, p. 45)

In 1791, ELISHA sold Stephen PEARCE 160 acres in Franklin and Wake Counties on Mocquerson Creek. (Franklin County Deed Book 7, p. 64) This land adjoined Matthew STRICKLAND, the South Prong of Mocquerson Creek, the Great Branch, Jesse BUNN, Stephen PEARCE and grave rock branch. (Possibly a part of one of the Aug. 9, 1779 grants) The deed was witnessed by James PEARCE and Richard UPCHURCH.

On March 15, 1794, ELISHA sold two tracts of land to William MORGAN of Nash County, in Franklin County on Turkey Creek. One deed, consisting of 300 acres and adjoining the County line and BRYANT, was witnessed by Jesse PEARCE, Richard UPCHURCH and Kinchen UPCHURCH (Franklin County Deed Book A, p. 272). The second deed, consisting of 300 acres in Franklin County on Turkey Creek, also adjoining BRYANT and the County line, evidently joined the first deed in some manner. These two parcels of land are apparently portions of the 1780 and 1781 grants of ELISHA.

Eight months later, on November 18, 1794, ELISHA sold Thomas RAY of Franklin County 42 acres in the fork of Mockerson Creek, adjoining James PEARCE, Thomas GAY and Thomas RAY (Franklin County Deed Book 10, p. 255). On May 2, 1795, ELISHA sold William SEAGRAVES of Wake County 40 acres of a tract of 240 acres adjoining MORGAN (see 1794 deeds), Hardy GRIFFIN, Wolf Harbor Branch, Spring Branch, the piny prong, and MASSEY. This deed was witnessed by Benjamin WHEELER and William WRAY (Franklin County Deed Book 8, p. 201).

Four months after selling the last of the above listed deeds, ELISHA STRICKLAND's will was brought into Wake County Court (Sept. 1795). He wrote and signed his will on February 23, 1795, sold the 1st parcel of land on May 2, 1795, and died sometime between May 2nd and September of 1795.

The name of ELISHA's wife is still unknown. A very good possibility is that her maiden name was UPCHURCH, but, so far, this is only speculation. The children and one grandchild are listed in Elisha's will as:

1. "my dearly beloved son, KINCHEN STRICKLAND...the maner plantation where I now live containing by Estimation three hundred akers Lying on both sides of Mokerson Creek"
2. son, ISAAC STRICKLAND "two hundred and fifty akers of Land Lying in the fork of Mokerson it being the Plantation where he now lives"
3. JACOB STRICKLAND, son
4. PRISSILLOR SEGRAVES, daughter
5. CHARITY JOHNSTON, daughter
6. ELIZABETH GRIFFIN, daughter
7. PATTE STRICKLAND, daughter
8. SALLE PACE, daughter
9. MILBRE STRICKLAND, granddaughter
10. MARY CARTER, no relationship given

The estate folder of ELISHA STRICKLAND of Wake County (located in the North Carolina Archives at Raleigh - original or "loose" papers) includes a paper showing on August 18, 1803, Brasel STRICKLAND, James CHAMBLEE and Matthew STRICKLING were bonded in the Wake County Court for Brasel STRICKLAND's appointment as guardian for Milbry STRICKLING, minor orphan. Milbry (also Milbrey & Milly) married William JONES on June 12, 1804, in Franklin County, North Carolina. At that time, she was probably between the ages of 15 and 20, which would indicate she was born between 1783 and 1789. She was either the only grandchild (not very probable) or the favorite grandchild of ELISHA in 1795, or her father had died at this time and, therefore, ELISHA left her a portion of his estate.

In June of 1805, a petition of Brasel STRICKLAND and Polly, his wife, was brought into the Wake County Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions (also located in Elisha Strickland's folder). The petition was brought against "Isaac Strickland & Others," to set aside the will of ELISHA STRICKLAND, because "that Legacy...given to Milly STRICKLAND was graudulently inserted. It being the intention of the Testator to give said Legacy to POLLY one of your petitioners," and that "be-

quests were made to the following persons, children of ELISHA, but by no means in Equal proportion. To JACOB STRICKLAND who lives in Anson County No. Carolina; to PRISILLA STRICKLAND intermarried with Jacob LEWIS which said Jacob LEWIS lives in the State of Georgia, the said PRISCILLA being dead having six children living in the State of Georgia whose names are unknown to your petitioners; CHARITY STRICKLAND intermarried with James JOHNSON residents of Georgia; ELIZABETH intermarried with Hardy GRIFFIN, which said ELIZABETH is dead having four children, to wit: James, Jincy, Jenny and Isaac, resident of Franklin. ISAAC STRICKLAND lives in Georgia; POLLY STRICKLAND intermarried with BASIL STRICKLAND your petitioners; SALLY STRICKLAND intermarried with John PACE - lives in Franklin; KINCHEN STRICKLAND lives in Georgia; MILLEY STRICKLAND intermarried with William JONES, residents of Franklin." It was ordered by the court that the above persons "appear on the first day of next term and that the insertion of the above order in the No. C. \_\_\_\_\_ (a newspaper) for 3 weeks be deemed sufficient notice."

Deeds have been located which indicate the approximate time ISAAC and KINCHEN left North Carolina and settled in Georgia. KINCHEN was living in Franklin County, NC, on November 26, 1802, when he sold 300 acres to JOHN PACE, "being the land held by ELISHA STRICKLAND, deceased, and given to his son KINCHEN by Will," on both sides of Mockerson Creek, partly in Wake County and partly in Franklin County. This land adjoined Richard UPCHURCH's Branch, James UPCHURCH, the widow PEARCE, "mouth of the Grave Rock in Wake County," Stephen PEARCE, Nathan UPCHURCH and William RAY. The deed was witnessed by ISAAC STRICKLAND and Nathan MASSEY (Franklin County Deed Book 12, p. 78).

In October, 1804, KINCHEN STRICKLAND of Wake County sold 400 acres to Joseph FREEMAN, located on SMITH's Creek "where the said STRICKLAND now lives," adjoining SULLIVAN, BENTON and HORTON (Wake County Deed Book T, p. 52). It was probably at this time KINCHEN moved to Georgia.

ISAAC STRICKLAND is listed on the 1790 Wake County Census with one female. On July 26, 1799, ISAAC of Franklin County sold William MORGIN of Nash County 95 acres on both sides of Turkey Creek, adjoining MORGAN, Wm. MARTIN, Wolf Harbor Branch, Spring Branch, and the County Line (Franklin County Deed Book 3, p. 68). The deed was witnessed by Obadiah STRICKLAND and William BRYANT. On August 7, 1799, ISAAC sold Wm. MARTIN 12 acres on Turkey Creek on the County Line, piney prong, and BOON's line (Franklin County Deed Book 3, p. 109) which was also witnessed by Obadiah STRICKLAND and William BRYANT. The last parcel of land sold by ISAAC in North Carolina, was purchased by Phillip PEARCE on December 10, 1802, in Franklin County. It consisted of 250 acres on the North Prong of Moccason Creek, adjoining Stephen PEARCE, South Prong, BUNN's Branch, Jesse BUNN, Meadow Branch, GAY and the orphan James PEARCE (Franklin County Deed Book 12, p. 87). The last deed is the 250 acres bequeathed to ISAAC by his father, ELISHA. ISAAC apparently moved to Georgia in 1802, after selling his legacy.

Grandads name were Andrew Jack Strickland. He had 2 sisters; one were Angline; I don't know the other one name. Thay were a Wilson Strickland in the famley some where; also a Lasas Strickland. Thay were a letter came to Antelope in the spring hunting for T. S. Strickland that got his mail there in 1885. We were the only Strickland that got thay mail there at that time. Aunt Elin had a girl name Calie. I never got the letter that came to Antelope. Thay were another man got it and my youngest Brother red it, and I never seen it, so I just got a part of what was on it, and I have bin trying to find out a Bout it evry since. The letter was mailed Georgia, But I can't find who wrote it. This was Mrs. B. M. Burfer(?) that had me to write you.

## BITS & PIECES

Occasionally we receive response or additional information from queries printed in Strickland Scene. The following is a letter from one of our members:

"Since sending in my query, which appeared on page 58 of Vol. 3 #3 of the Strickland Scene, I have found some information about my Strickland family - perhaps enough to give someone a clue.

In Book #1 of Wills, Pike Co., Ohio, appears the will of Jane STRICTLING, written 4 March 1847, and probated 16 March, 1852. She lived in Sunfish township, Pike Co., OH (this adjoins Adams Co.). The writing is quite good but names are rather difficult. She names a son, JACOB, who probably was named after his father since a JACOB STRICKLAND appears in the Pike County history as an early pioneer (possibly 1817 or 1818). She also names daughter SALLY CURRY, daughter MARY JANE FARRIS(?), daughter ELIZABETH BULLARD (the Ls have "squiggles" under them that may indicate something other than Ls; and there goes the family tradition of BURRIE or BURROWS.) She also names granddaughters MARY JANE STRICTLING and (my g. grandmother) MARIAH KEES.

There is a possibility that ALEXANDER STRICKLAND of Highland Co. is a connection. JACOB (JR.) appears in the Pike Co. Census.
