JOSEPH STRICKLAND witnessed the Will of JOHN CHARNEY of Upper Freehold Township, Monmouth Co., New Jersey, which was proven November 4, 1760.

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RICHARD AND LUCRETIA STRICKLAND

Additions And Corrections Submitted By Carol Kelly Nelson

In response to the article, Family Of Richard And Lucretia Strickland, printed in Strickland Scene, Vol. 4 No. 1, pp. 8-11, Carol Nelson graciously submitted the following notes:

ERROR: P. 8, 3rd paragraph, re: RICHARD. RICHARD died May 22, 1856, in MS; Lucretia lived with Benjamin Perryman Strickland until her death, between 1860 and 1870. Both are buried (Richard & Lucretia) in Haynie Cemetery, Alcorn County, MS, in unmarked graves. Benjamin Perryman, their son, did not die until 1901.

BENJAMIN P. STRICKLAND: According to the original CSA discharge, which my family has, Benj. Perry was about 5 ft. 10 in. tall, had dark complexion, dark eyes and dark hair. His discharge from CSA on 20 March 1865 was "because of partial loss of use of left leg - caused by old injury to left hip".

JULIA SWINDOLL STRICKLAND: She used to tell her grandchildren about the Civil War years when she tended home and children while Benj. P. was off fighting. She told of hearing the "war-men" passing night and day. The Battle of Shiloh was just some 20-odd miles away. She told about the stealing and raiding that went on, and how she had "sassed" the Yankees. She said salt was so scarce during and after the war that people boiled the salty water from their smoke-houses to get salt from the "crusts" that formed. There is a supposed relationship to Gen. Geo. Washington through Lucretia Bryant Strickland's line. My grandmother (daughter of Geo. W. Strickland & Cora D. Jordan) said Julia Swindoll Strickland could relate the exact lineage, but since no one ever wrote it down, the story died with Julia in 1920 at her death.

have extensive material on all descendants and donated my privately published work on most of them to you when I joined. (Editor's Note: OUR STRICKLAND FAMILY, DESCENDANTS OF JOHN AND MARGARET LAND STRICKLAND, 43 pages)

"It is very ironic that after my great-grandfather rode the train to San Diego to visit with his sister that the families lost contact again for another 50 years until I contacted Mrs. Jean Hughes of Tucson, AZ, a descendant of the sister, and the family historian of that line as I am the historian of our line. This happened in 1976. I also managed to contact descendants of the other brother said to 'have died somewhere in Texas 15 years ago'. Actually, he died in Oklahoma in 1915.

"I would very much like to share with anyone interested in any of these STRICKLANDS or LANDS."
