LETTER FROM THE EDITOR:

Dear Members,

I think its time we gave ourselves a pat on the back! We are beginning our fifth year of existence and the fifth year of Strickland Scene - AND - we are still charging the same amount of dues we began with. Even though we may have to go up on dues in the near future, I think it is quite an accomplishment to have held them at \$10 for five years.

In this issue, you will note I have begun an inventory of the Ancestor Files in the Strickland Library. As explained in the article, each Strickland we locate is given a number and an index card is made giving the reference (or brief information) as to where this person was located. If we have a copy of the document where this person's name appeared, we begin a file folder for this Strickland. If there is no document, his name remains in the index card file and he retains the number until we can begin a file folder on him. For this reason, many numbers are missing in the Ancestor File Folders. If your ancestor is not included in the list we are printing, it is because we simply do not have copies of documents containing his name. Some ancestors do not have file folders because I have not yet had time to create the file. If you have information on your ancestor, please send it to me and I will begin a file for this person. Many of the folders are on Georgia Stricklands because I have personally xeroxed material at the Georgia Archives, and many members with GA connections have sent material on these ancestors. When printing of the Ancestor Files are completed, I intend to continue the list of holdings in the Strickland Library so you will have an index to what is available; and will list new material as it is added to our collection.

As usual, I'm begging for help again. If you can donate a few minutes of time for any project, it will be greatly appreciated! One project I need help on this year is indexing the quarterly. If someone will index the first 3 issues as they receive them and get it to me as soon as possible after the third issue, I can index the fourth issue in time to place the entire index in the fourth issue.

Another project I need help on this year is the Ancestor Chart Book we are planning to print in 1984. If you can type a few of the charts, please let me know. I can send you copies of charts to type or you are welcome to come to my house and use my typewriter.

A third project I would like to see done this year, and probably printed in Strickland Scene, is an index to place names used in the quarterly, Volume 1 through Volume 5. This type of index would be a help to researchers looking for information in a particular area. If this isn't possible, I believe we should at least have a table of contents for each volume showing the area covered by each article. Let me know if you would be interested in digging into this project.

Remember to mark October 20th and 21st on your calendar for our Annual General Meeting in Atlanta this year. Let's make this the biggest and best meeting we have ever had.

One other reminder - if you have not submitted an ancestor chart, please do so.

DESCENDANTS OF THOMAS FAIN, REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIER

The following are excerpts from an article entitled, "Thomas Fain, Soldier in the American Revolution." The actual reference is unknown.

Thomas Fain was a Private in the North Carolina line during the Revolutionary War and fought in the Battle of King's Mountain...Nicholas Fain, father of Thomas, served in the Revolution with at least five of his seven sons...

Thomas Fain married Mary Parramore, October 25, 1781, and as they moved southward they lived for periods in Burke, Bullock and Screven counties. By 1801 he was living in Telfair county on the Ocmulgee River (GA), and served as Justice of Telfair Inferior Court from 1817 to 1819. Next, he moved to southwest Georgia and settled in Decatur County about 1825 in the area of Attapulugus, first known as the Borough of Pleasant Grove. On October 27, 1827, he purchased Lot 54, District 22, also Lot 259, 20th District, Decatur County. This property is approximately ten miles south of Bainbridge near the Georgia-Florida line.

To Thomas and Mary Parramore Fain were born twelve children, three sons and nine daughters: Mathew; Elizabeth, who died young; Lavinia (Mrs. William McMullan); Nancy who died young; Mary (Mrs. John Martin); Rebecca (Mrs. James McMullen); Clara (Mrs. Jefferson Reuben Strickland); Thomas Parramore; William, who died young; and Lavincy (Mrs. Joseph Marshall)...

Clara Fain, seventh child of Thomas Fain and Mary Parramore Fain, married Jefferson STRICKLAND, Dec. 11, 1828, in Decatur County. Reuben Strickland was an early settler in the southern part of the county also. Their children were: Reuben, who died young; Lucretia, who married Hoshiah Lewis Perritt from Beaufort District, S.C.; Matthew who married Hester Matthew; Thomas Jefferson, who married America Gandy and Greenberry, who married Emily Washam...

Thomas Parramore Fain and his wife, Elizabeth, were members of a very early

Primitive Baptist Church at Fainsville, south of Faceville. Reuben STRICKLAND and his wife were also members. John Thomas Fain, a grandson, served as Treasurer of Decatur County for the year 1878.

Additional Information Contributed by W. Jeanne Mead RE: REUBEN STRICKLAND FAMILY

(Excerpt of letter, dated July 13, 1939, from Stella B. Strickland Edwards of Decatur, IL, to Josiah Henry Perritt)

Reuben Strickland was born near Raleigh, N.C. He was 12 years old when the Revolutionary War was over in 1781 or 1782. His father fought in this war. Henry Strickland, grandson of Reuben, says that he believes the name of Reuben's father was Uriah. I saw in the Roster of N.C. soldiers that Frederick was the only Strickland from Wake County that went to war but it is possible that Uriah's name was left out of the Roster.

From N.C., Reuben moved to South Carolina, says Henry Strickland, and this statement is borne out by the fact that Neil, in 1860 census of Decatur County, Ga. (Bainbridge), gave his birthplace as S.C. Neil is the older son of Reuben by his second wife. Reuben, we believe, married a Miss Wilson the first time and that they had a child which they named Noah Wilson; that when Wilson was a baby his mother was killed (she had gone to a well at twelve o'clock noon to water a mule which kicked her and killed her immediately). I believe that Wilson was called Noah by some, and Wilson by others. In about a year after his first wife's death, Reuben married again.

To this second marriage of Reuben Strickland (Note: Later information reveals that Reuben married - 2nd - to Sarah Hickman 1797 in S.C.), were born the following children:

Reuben Jefferson Strickland died May 9, 1859. Clara, Reuben's wife, died Aug. 6, 1872. (Clara was born Sept. 23, 1795)

Around 1820, Reuben Strickland and his family came to Bainbridge, Ga., because I saw in the Tax Book where he bought land in 1826 and 1827, and so did David and Savage, his sons.

If we have a copy of the document, or copies of other information on this person, we begin a file folder on this particular Strickland. If there are no copies of documents, his name remains in the index card file and he retains the number until we can begin a file folder on him. It is for this reason many numbers are missing in the Ancestor Files. If your ancestor is not included in this list, it is because we simply do not have copies of documents containing his name. If you are interested in obtaining a copy of any documents listed, we ask you to cover the costs of making copies. A donation of 20¢ to 25¢ per sheet will usually cover the cost of xeroxing and part of the postage.

In the Name of God Amen, I, William Strickland of North Carolina and County of Northampton Being sick and weak in Body but in perfect mind and Memory thanks be to almighty God for it and Calling unto mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing it is appointed for all to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament principally as followeth-

First, I Recomend my Soul into the hands of almighty God and my Body to the Ground to be buried in a desent manner at the Discretion of my Executors and all my Worldly Estate which It has pleased God to bless me with in this Life, I Give in the following manner and form-

Item, I give the use of all my Estate to my Beloved Wife, Mary Strickland, Be it any kind or Quality Whatsoever During her Natural Life, and after her Decease I give my mare to my son, Nathan Strickland, and the Resedue of my Estate I Leave to be Equally Devided between Benjamin Strickland, Lucrana (Lurana?) Pulley, Mary Pulley, Martha Strickland and Nancy Strickland, To them and their Heirs forever.

I Doo appoint My Wife, Mary Strickland, and my son, William Strickland, my whole and Soul Executors of this my Last Will and Testament In Witness Whereof I the said William Strickland hath here unto set my hand and affixed seal the First Day of February One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty Six, Enter _____ befor assind

TON. While in Penrith, which is in the beautiful northern area of England, we went
to the Strickland Hotel and was informed that someone from America had been there
recently searching for Strickland genealogy. The Castle is open from April to Sep-
tember only on Wednesday from 2:00-4:45 p.m. The Public Library in Penrith and
others referred us to the Sizergh for information on the genealogy of Stricklands.

of Madison Co., post office Danielsville; aged 67 years. No wife or children named nor birthplace or date. Allowed 80 acres Warrent #45348 Act of 1850, applied May 30, 1855 for additional land, Act of 1855, resident of Tishamango Co., MS. Received 80 acres Warrent #25418 Act of 1855.

My great-great grandfather HENRY went to Lowndes Co., GA and in same area were many surnames which had been found in and near Savannah - Salzburger descendants. His son, Thomas Butler STRICKLAND, b. 17 Jan. 1832, married Sarah Wesinbaker, daughter of Richard WESINBAKER, in March 1865. Allied names are: McCALL, LANIER, HARRIS, and COOK.
